Bolton is Greater Manchester's Town of Culture 2024!


We're really happy to be part of the Bolton Town of Culture team.





Bolton Aquarium was the first institution in the world where 'The Pygmy Glass Danio' were regularly bred.

The exhibition highlights this tiny transparent fish that has recently become very important for science around the world as it can make a big noise which is as loud as a gun shot. The noise is way of communicating with each other.



Rites of Passage Sat 9 November to Sun 5 January, Up Close Gallery

In 2023, local charity Precious Gems worked with 14 women to identify the important events in their lives and to record those they viewed as "Rites of Passage".

Through film, photographs and objects, this unique exhibition explores the women's experiences over time, capturing key moments, such as engagements, weddings, and first haircuts.

The project was made possible with funding from The National Lottery Heritage Fund.

This exhibition features a collection of captivating images taken by pupils from Essa Primary and St Peter & St Paul's RC Primary School. The pupils worked with a professional photographer to reinterpret and update Humphrey Spender's iconic Mass Observation photographs taken in the late 1930s.

'Queen of Egyptology' comes to Bolton, 140 years after she helped create the Museum's Collection

Newly conserved 130-year-old oil painting of Egypt Exploration Society (EES) founder, Amelia Edwards is on temporary display in Bolton for the first time.

The painting was unveiled in June on the 140th anniversary of the founding of Bolton's First Museum, the Chadwick Museum in Queen's Park, which opened to the public on the 12 June 1884.

Amelia Edwards founded the Egypt Exploration Society in 1882 to excavate and record Egyptian heritage after she visited Egypt in 1873.

She recruited Local Honorary
Secretaries across the world to raise
funds for the work of the Society,
including Bolton's own Annie Barlow,
through whom much of Bolton's 12,000
strong ancient Egyptian collection was
formed and is the largest in a local
authority museum in the UK.

The painting, which is on display in Bolton Museum, was donated by a Mrs Manston from Redruth in Cornwall.

This year, one of the mesmerising light installations will be Gaia, created by UK artist Luke Jerram who brought the Museum of the Moon to last year's festival. Measuring six metres in diameter, Gaia features 120dpi detailed NASA imagery of the Earth's surface (compiled from the Visible Earth series). The artwork provides the opportunity to see our planet on this scale, floating in three-dimensions.
